GCSE Results 2016

This year Kingshill School's GCSE results were excellent and included some outstanding personal achievements.

- 68% of Year 11 pupils achieved 5 or more A* C grades, including English and Mathematics, at GCSE
- 76% of Year 11 pupils achieved 5 or more A* C grades at GCSE
- 24% of all Year 11 GCSE grades were at A* or A
- 76% of all Year 11 GCSE grades were at A* C

Congratulations to all our Year 11 pupils. They worked very hard throughout Year 11 and the pupils were a credit to themselves, their parents and the school. The staff worked persistently hard to raise pupil expectations, encouraging and supporting the pupils throughout their GCSE courses. 
The reviews are in!


The summer term ended brightly with the school production of 'Into the Woods'. Over 200 pupils performed, played instruments or helped behind the scenes in this unique fantasy musical.

The plot is full of familiar characters and elements of the darkest fairy stories, but combined in an original, funny and energetic way. Whilst based on elements of well-known children's stories, there was nothing simple about this show which required pupils to dance, sing and act in tightly choreographed scenes.

Transformation was a key theme throughout and the school gym was unrecognisable after instillation of the professional lighting rig and weeks of construction of an intricate and beautifully hand-built

Musically, the production was also complex and highly challenging because it often needed to be discordant in order to create a sense of disorientation and threat. Within this however were wonderful moments of humour delivered with perfect timing. The pace of the performance was breath-taking and testament to the huge amount of time that the pupils gave after school and at weekends rehearsing with the Head of Expressive Arts, Ms Stones.



Year 10 Parent/ Tutor Evening and Introduction to Key Stage 4

The beginning of Year 10 can feel a big step up from Key Stage 3 with the challenges of GCSE study already well underway.

During this evening, on Monday 10th October 2016, pupils and parents were provided with an overview of important changes to the GCSE curriculum including the move away from letter grades (A*-G) in assessment to the new 1-9 numerical system. There was also some important guidance on ensuring effective study habits both at home and in school and a reinforcement of the value of excellent attendance. Based on the results of the Year 11 pupils in 2016, our top achievers all had attendance of over 98.5%! The evening also provided a valuable opportunity for tutors and parents to discuss any early successes or areas of concern.

Post-16 Information Evening

On Tuesday 20th September 2016, we welcomed Year 11 pupils and their parents for our Post-16 Information Evening. This event provided key details regarding the vast range of courses available for study to our pupils when they leave Cirencester Kingshill School. From A-Levels to Apprenticeships and Diplomas to BTECs, there is a huge range of choice of further and higher education for young people today and within our local area, an equally huge variety of colleges and schools to choose from!

Pupils were encouraged to recognise the value of hard work and good attendance during their final year at Kingshill School so that they achieve the very best results possible. Equally as important though is the emphasis on them developing independence and initiative to ensure that they are prepared for life beyond school. Increasingly, colleges, universities and employers are placing great significance on the value of work experience, voluntary and community-based work in developing a sense of individual and social responsibility.
