## **Remote teaching**

As you will be aware from our recent letter home, we have had a case of COVID-19 in school recently that had an impact on some of our staff through track and trace. No pupils were affected or were required to self-isolate, however a number of teachers were required to self-isolate at home, albeit thankfully they have all remained safe and well.

In order to limit the disruption to pupil learning in school as a result of this, we have taken this opportunity to investigate remote teaching, and have had a number of those teachers who were having to remain at home, remote in to lessons via MS Teams, and teach their lessons from home. Supported by a member of staff in the classroom to supervise the pupils, this has meant that continuation of teaching and learning has been possible by class teachers, and pupils have experienced very little disruption as a result of their teacher not being in school.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank both the pupils and teachers involved for their resilience and willingness to work in this slightly different way. Whilst this is not something that I hope we will have to rely on very often, I am pleased that we have this as an option and that pupils embraced it as a way to be taught in those lessons affected.

Y10 have been sitting a series of mock examinations over the last two weeks, the first examinations that they have experienced in a formal examination setting. I am very proud of how well they all handled themselves and of the mature approach that they took. They should be proud of themselves and my thanks go to them all for their continued hard work.
