We know from descriptions of the Celts like Boudicca, that the indigenous people living in Britain before the Roman invasion were most likely to be white. These tribes were very varied but DNA shows us that they most originated from tribes in France. There is no doubt however that during Roman Britain there were people from other parts of the world. We don't necessarily know what skin colour these people had, but we do know that there was movement; we have North Africans attested on Hadrian's wall, for example. However, it's very difficult to quantify exact numbers, as our evidence is full of uncertainties. We have inscriptions which tell us where people were from. These might say, for example, that someone comes from North Africa or from Italy. The BBC children's video of Roman Britain is 'pretty accurate'. I think, for example, that the BBC character was loosely based on Quintus Urbicus, a man from what is now Algeria, who became governor of Britain; you can still visit his grand tomb at Tiddis. Roman Britain would have been black and white. We do not know the percentages but Britain has been racially diverse for over 2500 years.

Dr Hella Eckardt (2017) What kind of life did migrants in Roman Britain lead?

Often the migrant skeletons we look at are from very wealthy graves. For example, the 'Ivory Bangle Lady' was found in a stone coffin alongside glass vases and expensive jewellery. It is likely that many migrants in this period were wealthy and wealthy people were in charge.
