


The **Eden Project** (Cornish: *Edenva*) is a visitor attraction in Cornwall, England, United Kingdom.

The first set of domes simulate a tropical environment and the second, a Mediterranean environment.

The attraction also has an outside botanical garden which is home to many plants and wildlife native to Cornwall and the UK in general; it also has

many plants that provide an important and interesting backstory, for example, those with a **prehistoric** heritage.

Since 2002, the Project has hosted a series of musical performances, called the Eden Sessions.

The Core is the latest addition to the site and opened in September 2005. It provides the Eden Project with an education facility, incorporating classrooms and exhibition spaces designed to help communicate Eden's central message about the relationship between people and plants.

Task 2: Disneyland

Read the extract and answer the questions

Disneyland Paris, originally Euro Disney Resort, is an entertainment resort in Marne-la-Vallée, a new town located 32 km (20 mi) east of the centre of Paris, and is the most visited theme park in all of France and Europe. The resort covers 4,800 acres (19 km²)[3] and encompasses two theme parks, several resort hotels, a shopping, dining, and entertainment complex, and a golf course, in addition to several additional recreational and entertainment venues.

According to the Disneyland Paris website the theme park's top five attractions are It's a Small
World, Space Mountain: Mission 2, Big Thunder
Mountain, Pirates of the Caribbean, and Buzz
Blast. [36][37]

It's a Small World is located in the Fantasyland portion of the park. It takes the visitor on a musical tour of the world while multicultural dolls sing the song "It's a Small World". The park visitors travel through the attraction in a small boat which follows a river that runs through the attraction, with each part of the ride themed for a different part of the world. Space Mountain: Mission 2 is located in the Discoveryland portion of the park. It is a roller coaster-like ride that "will blast you on a warp-speed ride into the unknown."

Big Thunder Mountain is located in Frontierland. This is a "runaway train" through the man-made "sierras of Big Thunder Mountain." [36][39]

Pirates of the Caribbean is located in Adventureland. Contrary to popular belief, the Pirates of the Caribbean franchise drew inspiration from the ride.

Buzz Lightyear Laser Blast is located in Discoveryland. It was inspired by the Disney/Pixar movie Toy Story 2. In this attraction the visitor sits in a star cruiser and shoots laser beams at targets. The more targets they hit the more points they earn. This ride is advertised as good for families with little ones, even though it is also listed that it may frighten young children. [39]

After a summer of speculation, Welsh forward Gareth Bale has finally completed a world record £85m (100m euros) transfer from Tottenham to Real Madrid. He will earn a reported £300,000 a week after signing a six-year contract. But are sky-high footballers' wages too much?

Steven Powell, policy director of the Football Supporters' Federation said:

Gareth Bale's new employers Real Madrid will - if reports are to be believed - be paying him more than £250,000 a week. That's £13m a year. Put another way, the Welshman will earn in just seven days what many of those who'll follow him in the stands at the Estadio Bernabeu earn in an entire decade. Nice work if you can get it.

Steven Paul Jobs was an American inventor, designer and entrepreneur who was the co-founder, chief executive and chairman of Apple Computer. Apple's revolutionary products, which include the iPod, iPhone and iPad, are now seen as dictating the evolution of modern technology.

Born in 1955 to two University of Wisconsin graduate students who gave him up for adoption, Jobs was smart but directionless, dropping out of college and experimenting with different pursuits before cofounding Apple with Steve Wozniak in 1976. Jobs left the company in 1985, launching Pixar Animation Studios, then returned to Apple more than a decade later. Jobs died in 2011 following a long battle with pancreatic cancer.
